# Food Closet



#### Food Price Increases for February

As we have all seen, food and gas prices have sky-rocketed. From March  $2^{nd}$  – March  $9^{th}$ , a loaf of Meijer white bread rose 20 cents. In the March  $11^{th}$  **Detroit Free Press** it ran an article that stated "Grocery prices not seen this high since '81". Costs to buy food in stores are up nearly 8% for the year.

## Save the Date! – Saturday, May 14

According to the Letter Carriers' website, their "**Stamp Out Hunger**" food drive is a go for 2022! In the past, **all** food collected by the Belleville Post Office is donated to the Emergency Food Closet. This food fundraiser will need many hands! Volunteers will be needed to transport, check dates, sort, box, and shelve donated items. The last food drive was held in May of 2019 and over 11,000 pounds of food was donated by our community.

All collected food returns to the Belleville Post Office to be weighed. Volunteers will be needed to transport it from the Post Office to the church. This will happen in waves as the carriers continue to drop off food all day. Once it arrives at the church, the food needs to be brought downstairs to the fellowship hall to be sorted either as food for the weekly bags, cart food, or for migrant workers/homeless shelters. At each of these stations, expiration dates will be checked. Food for the weekly bags will be sorted according to food type, placed in trays/boxes, and stored in the food closet. The rest of the food will be boxed and labelled as either cart food or migrant/homeless.

On the 14<sup>th</sup> volunteers should meet at the church at 11:15 for a short meeting. If you are a transporter, you will then be sent to the Post Office. We will work at the church until 6 p.m. We will try to finish before and after services on Sunday, May 15. If there is still food to be checked, sorted and stored, we will finish on Monday, May 16 and if needed, Tuesday, May 17.

Whatever help and time you can give will be greatly appreciated!

#### Summary and Results of the March 19 Worship Retreat

Hallelujah! Praise God in his holy house of worship, praise him under the open skies; Praise him for his acts of power, praise him for his magnificent greatness; Praise with a blast on the trumpet, praise by strumming soft strings; Praise him with castanets and dance, praise him with banjo and flute; Praise him with cymbals and a big bass drum, praise him with fiddles and mandolin. Let every living, breathing creature praise God! Hallelujah! Psalm 150 (MSG)

The Worship Retreat planning team (Pastor Mary, Joy Dubin, Michael Gross, Susan Featheringill, Val Moore, and Jill Sestok) would again like to thank all of you who participated in this vital retreat. The morning was filled with centering us in God's presence and then hearing information about the reality of where BFUMC is concerning attendance, target audience using demographic information, and opening our minds to non-dual thinking by using the process of the matrix. (If any of this makes you curious and you were not able to attend, please contact me and I will be glad to share.)

The afternoon found us in seven small groups around tables discussing the following seven questions:

- 1. PURPOSE: Why does worship exist?
- 2. How do you experience worship here @ BFUMC?
- 3. Where are we in worshipping @ Belleville First?
- 4. EVALUATION: How does BFUMC's worship align with God's purpose?
- 5. Where are we (BFUMC) trying to go with worship?
- 6. How do we get there? How might we need to transform BFUMC's worship?
- 7. How do we know if worshipping is on track...
  - ... or if we need to adjust if we're not?

The discussion does not have to stop with March 19<sup>th</sup> as I told those in attendance. These are ongoing questions, so feel free to discuss them within your own groups and report back any revelations that might emerge.

At the conclusion of the discussion, the retreat team put together a ballot with six items. The first five were topics that need further investigation and priority. The sixth question was a choice about the vehicle we would take to get there. When the ballots were gathered and counted by Susan Featheringill and Joy Dubin, the results were as follows:

#### Topics in order of priority:

- 1. Praise...creating a worship service that is alive, vibrant, exciting, and welcoming as we offer praise to God from whom all blessings flow
- 2. Communication...creating a communications team and possibly hiring a communications team leader to market and get BFUMCs name and activities to the wider public in a more intentional and strategic way
- 3. Outreach...creating opportunities for the community to come into BFUMC while also reaching out and getting out into the community of Belleville.
- 4. Community...creating deeper and stronger community within our faith congregation through worship & sacraments, the common table, and growth (small) groups while also creating partnerships with those within the community of Belleville to be in service with the community (the response to our worship)
- 5. Change...(I laughed out loud when I saw this as the last priority.) In reality, each of the top four priorities will result in change. Change is inevitable and what I understand is that by having change as one of our priorities, we are in essence saying we know change is coming and we are ready to participate in and rejoice in the change is I also understand that there will be grief and we need to feel the feelings so that our grief doesn't hold us hostage in bygone moments of time.

We will be tackling one priority at a time, and we will be asking for your help as volunteers to be on a special task force to implement these priorities into the life of BFUMC. Once we have proceeded through each of these priorities, we may retreat again to discover where God is calling us to go next. Please continue to pray for and with the teams working on the priorities and for your own willingness to say, "Yes," when asked to serve.

In the group of 15 from Ad Council and Worship Committee, the decision on the vehicle of worship question is as follows:

Two services—3 votes One service—7 votes New service—5 votes

The work done by all of you on Saturday was just a beginning. The worship committee is already meeting to begin creating an alive, vibrant, exciting, and welcoming worship service that allows us to offer praise to God from whom all blessings flow. The implementation of one service that blends elements that we all know and love with additions of some elements we haven't experienced before will not be immediate. It will take time to create, and it may mean that what we start with will continue to change and develop as the weeks go on. Keep an eye on CCB, the Belleville News, and the newsletter for future news on implementation.

Also, especially to those who have been so faithful to choir and to praise band, we thank you and we want you to know that none of what you have done in your musical areas is going away, it may just look different in one worship service.



#### Summary and Results of the March 19 Worship Retreat (Continued)

As your pastor, what I observed on Saturday was a church passionate about worship. Do you know how that warms God's heart? Also, I recognized how music is very important to some of you. Music is God's gift for us, but I want to remind us as we create one service, that we are worshipping God: Loving Creator, Loving Friend, Loving Spirit. We do not worship music. (Go check out the book of Exodus for how worshipping an idol worked out for the Israelites!) So as you await the inevitable changes ahead, I challenge you to pray to God daily asking God to keep your mind, heart, and soul open to the future of worship at BFUMC.

Again, thank you for your passion for worship. There's more work to be done, but God is with us and guiding us every step of the way.
