




Message from the Pastor





Synopsis: "In an effort to keep the peace, we often agree to disagree about

sexuality.

We fear that when we start talking conflict might escalate quickly from respectful disagreement to hurtful accusations...Yet, the storyteller in Genesis offers us an invitation to slow down and begin again...God created humankind. We are told we're different from the rest of creation: We are made in the image of God. Not just some of us but all of us." Today, we will expand on the conversation we had with Bishop David Bard. We will I learn how to stay in the conversation, cultivate affection for one another, and how to listen with compassion as we are in conversation

with those with whom we do not agree.

Synopsis: Whether it's the abuse and violence we experience behind the closed doors of

our homes or behind the front doors of our churches, we all sense there is a better way to live this life. In this Psalm, "David didn't expect a threat to emerge from the community of support that he'd chosen." And neither do we. Yet, because we are all human, we sometimes experience inhumane treatment from one another. What role does forgiveness play? How do we begin to break down the walls of silence that keep us running in terror? How do we being to

live again?

Numbers to Date

Since January 1, 2021, we have been distributing food on a weekly basis to all clients due to the overwhelming generosity of so many. From January 1st through August 31st, we have distributed 1,123 bags of food to 108 families and have 51 new clients. With the beginning of a new school year, letters were mailed last week to all district principals and to the principal of Keystone Academy to inform them of our presence. Our Emergency Food Closet brochure was included as well as a list of other sources of food in the community that can be shared with staff and duplicated for families who may need assistance.

Can/Bottle Drive

Steve Dolot of Van Buren Township, a non-verbal adult who has multiple impairments, has been returning cans and bottles with the help of his aide and family that have been collected at Belleville First United Methodist Church since last October. His fundraising effort has raised \$2,705 for the Emergency Food Closet to help feed the hungry in our community. Thank you to everyone who has donated cans and bottles to this ongoing fundraiser!

Goat T-Shirts

Belleville City Councilman, Ken Voight, who is also a graphic artist, designed the "goat" T-shirt. He is donating **ALL** the proceeds from this shirt sale to the Emergency Food Closet. The shirts are available at Egan's Pub at 396 Main St. and are \$20. John Juriga is modeling his "goat" shirt.

Thanks to Doug & Pat Cook and Jim & Cheryl Wagner, our clients have been treated to lots of fresh vegetables from their gardens. Ms. Becky and Nidia brought Regan, Lyla, Raquel and Christopher, all preschoolers, from Becky & Jessica's Place located at 970 Savage Rd., Van Buren Township, with vegetables including corn, cucumbers, yellow and green squash, and green peppers. The day center has a garden and the children help care for it. One of their lessons is sharing and helping others.
