Covenants

A biblical covenant is the “binding or establishing of a relationship between two parties... - both between people and God.” If you type in the word covenant in the search engine in Biblegateway.com, you’ll find literally hundreds of references to covenants in both the Old and the New Testament, between God and God’s people and between people and people in the Bible. Covenants move people forward. Covenants remind people of God and God’s love and provision. Covenants bind us together.

Covenants come out of many situations and for several reasons. The Covenant of New Beginnings came out of a need to create space for conversation to continue in healthy ways during conflicts and disagreements. The challenges that the Church with a big “C” and the local church face can be divisive. The Covenant of New Beginnings recognizes those challenges and puts into place a path toward unity.

The beginnings of a covenant formed in a conversation between Joy Dubin, the Ad Council chair, and I. We discussed the importance of the vows each of us have taken as members of the United Methodist Church. That is why the first two parts of the covenant incorporate the baptismal and membership vows. Then we pondered two resources that offer ways to be in holy conversation in the midst of disagreement and conflict. Those resources are the United Methodist publication *Living Faithfully* and the book, *Brave Church* by Elizabeth Hagan, I preached on in September of 2021. We mused together the instructions on how to talk and be with one another when we don’t see eye to eye.

Message from the Pastor

Once we had a framework, we invited some key leadership, both formal and informal, to work on the covenant to bring it to a finalized form. This group helped clean up the grammar and added the use of Matthew 18:15-20 and the General Rules of the United Methodist Church. Then the covenant was presented to the committee chairs for feedback. Finally, on January 4, at the Ad Council meeting, the Covenant of New Beginnings was affirmed and passed as the way that this faith community will proceed into the future. On January 23 & 30, town hall meetings took place between worship to answer any questions or concerns with the intent to free those in attendance to make a commitment to sign the covenant at a later date.

This month, at our Connection Worship Service on February 6, 2022, we will sign the Covenant of New Beginnings and we will walk forward in faith loving God and loving one another as we put this covenant into action. It is the hope of the Ad Council that when conflicts or disagreements arise, we can all refer to this covenant and utilize the healthy communication strategies within its content. The Ad Council also recognizes that there will be conflict and disagreements, but now the faith community does not have to be fearful when addressing them.

The Church with a big “C” has had conflicts and divisions since the early church (Acts 15!). That part of our humanity is not going away. Yet, with a deliberate and caring covenant in place, Belleville First, can walk together into the future unafraid and ready to make disciples with Jesus for the transformation of the world—including us.

I give thanks for all that God has already given us and I continue to welcome each person in Christian love. As a member together with each person in the body of Christ and in this congregation of The United Methodist Church, I renew my covenant faithfully to participate in the ministries of the Church by my prayers, my presence, my gifts, my service, and my witness, that in everything God may be glorified through Jesus Christ.

The God of all grace, who has called us to eternal glory in Christ, establish us and strengthen us that we may live in hope, grace, and peace.

With these vows renewed, I also understand how we are at odds with each other at times and how we can become divided from one another. In order for our community of faith to move forward in unity I will:

- live by the Christ Rule (Matthew 18: 15-20)
- live into the United Methodist General Rules: do no harm, do good, stay in love with God
- accept conflict and commit to the way of kindness by listening respectfully without interrupting
- use "I" statements instead of "you" statements, not accuse or attack individuals, and criticize ideas, not individuals
- avoid blame, speculation, and inflammatory language
- allow everyone the chance to speak
- avoid assumptions about any member or generalizations about social groups
- not ask individuals to speak for their (perceived) social group





2021 Emergency Food Closet Report

The Emergency Food Closet housed at Belleville First United Methodist Church has been feeding the hungry in Van Buren and Sumpter Townships and the City of Belleville since 1983. It has served as an emergency source of food for those that have lost a job, been injured, are ill, or are temporarily unemployed; for our seniors, veterans, and disabled who do not have enough food or income to last through the month; and those in need per referrals from our local schools and pastors. Referrals are good for a year.

No one is ever turned away! Everyone receives food on his/her first visit. To continue to receive food, he/she needs to bring a Michigan driver's license or State ID, proof of residency (rent receipt, tax bill, utility bill), and a referral from the Salvation Army, Community Care Services, the Department of Health and Human Services, a doctor, a social worker, a school principal or counselor, or from a pastor.

In 2021, the Emergency Food Closet served 138 families and distributed 1,800 bags of food. 86 of these families were new clients this year.

34% came 1 time
11% came 2 times

This may be due to:

- 1) client needed temporary help
- 2) client doesn't want to pursue getting a referral
- 3) client knows he/she won't qualify for help

35% of the clients are a 1 member family
43% are families with children

7% of the families have 5 or more members and receive 2 bags of food, and double refrigerator, personal care, and cart items

54% of the clients are over age 60

The weekly bag menu is different for each week of the month. Each bag always has 2 cans of soup, fruits, and vegetables. Twice a month clients receive canned tuna, chicken, spaghetti sauce and spaghetti noodles, and peanut butter and jelly. Other items include sloppy joe mix, canned chili, rice-a-roni, tuna or chicken pasta helper, mac and cheese, snack crackers, saltines, graham crackers, boxed potatoes, Chef Boyardee products, pork and beans, muffin mix, and popcorn. Breakfast items include cereal, oatmeal, pancake mix and syrup. Refrigerator items include: a choice of one lb. ground hamburger or ground turkey; one dairy-cheese, eggs or margarine; and one choice of lunchmeat-ham, turkey, roast beef, bologna, salami, or hot dogs. In addition, each client gets a loaf of bread and a 4 roll package of toilet paper.

For Thanksgiving, in addition to the weekly bag, each client received a \$25 Meijer Food Only gift card. 67 cards were passed out at a cost of \$1,675.

For Christmas, in addition to the weekly bag, each client received a \$25 Meijer Food Only gift card. 62 cards were passed out at a cost of \$1,550.

In prior years, special Thanksgiving and Christmas bags were packed for a special meal. This was discontinued due to the expense. Giving a client a gift card lets the client get the food he/she likes and needs. During the pandemic food quantities have been limited.

Each weekly bag costs \$25-\$35 a bag depending on what items are included and what refrigerated items are selected. A yearly budget is not easy to estimate but could range from \$45,000 to \$63,000 (1,800 x \$25 and 1,800 x \$35). Due to the pandemic we have not received food from the Post Office "Stamp Out" Hunger Food Drive for the past two years which helped stock the shelves. Most of our funding comes from the Meijer Simply Give campaigns. The rest is from the generosity of our congregation, community residents, local churches and businesses.

Meijer has selected our food closet to partner with during their Winter Simply Give Campaign at the Belleville Meijer store located at 9701 Belleville Rd. The Winter Simply Give Campaign runs from January 2nd through April 2nd, 2022. The campaign has two Double Match Days – Saturday, March 5th and Saturday, March 26th. If you would like to purchase a Simply Give card, please purchase on Double Match Days. On these two days, Meijer will double what one donates on the card. If one buys a \$10 card, Meijer will donate \$20, for a total donation of \$30. If we can raise locally \$5,000 total on these two Double Match Days, Meijer will match up to \$10,000.

During the last week of February, letters will be mailed to the schools, churches, and local businesses in the community to ask for their support for this fundraiser. Articles will also be submitted to the Belleville Independent to make the community aware.
