We find ourselves involved in loyal commitments, not needing to force our way in life, able to marshal and direct our energies wisely. Galatians 5:22-23 (MSG)

Meijer's Simply Give Campaign

The **Emergency Food Closet** has been selected by our local Meijer store located at 9701 Belleville Rd. to participate in its *Fall Simply Give Campaign*. The Campaign dates are Sunday, July 3 through Saturday, October 1. *DOUBLE MATCH DAYS ARE SET FOR Saturday, <u>AUGUST 13</u> and Saturday, <u>SEPTEMBER 10</u>.*

The **Simply Give Campaign** is the **Emergency Food Closet's** biggest fundraiser of the year. This provides 85% of the funds used to purchase food for our clients for the year. You can purchase a **Simply Give** card at the check-out aisle for \$10 on any day between July 3rd and October 1st.

Your \$10 donation goes directly into our **Simply Give** account. When the campaign is over and the donations are tallied, the **Emergency Food Closet** is given **Food Only** gift cards to spend in the amount raised. This pays for the food for the weekly bags and the meat and dairy products we distribute.

If you plan on donating during the campaign, the best days to buy your **Simply Give** cards is <u>August 13</u> and/or <u>September 10</u>. On these two dates, Meijer will double the amount of what you purchase. For example, if you purchase a \$10 card, Meijer will match it with \$20, for a total contribution of \$30. Meijer will double match up to \$10,000 per pantry during double match days.

The **Simply Give** cards are located at the end of each checkout aisle. Take a card (or several) and give to the cashier. She/he will scan the card/cards to activate and credit the **EFC** account. You keep the cards so that you can claim the amount as a tax donation. Turn in your store receipt with your name and the card purchase circled to Micky or put in the collection basket. It will be credited to your monthly BFUMC statement.

Please share this information with your family and friends so that this fundraising campaign is a *huge success*!
